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## LETTER FROM THE FOUNDER

As I reflect on the journey of Saadhya, I am reminded of the many ups and downs we have encountered. From struggling to find a rented space, staff, and funds to now seeing large organisations step forward to support our work, it has been a humbling and inspiring path. The support we have received has enabled us to stay committed to our cause, working with unwavering passion and empathy.



When we first began, our focus was limited to institutional programs for around 25 to 50 children. Today, we have not only expanded our institutional capacity but also moved into community-based work. The response has motivated us to push forward, making a difference in the lives of many more children.

This year, one of our major milestones was beginning the construction of a permanent facility for 500 children in Hosapete, spread over 24,174 square feet, with an estimated budget of ₹7.93 crores. Additionally, our community work, particularly our early intervention and therapy units, has seen remarkable progress. These units are bringing more children into school, and we now have 700 admission requests. Through our early intervention program, we have identified 215 children across 10 Gram Panchayats in Hosapete taluk, offering them essential support like aids, appliances, physiotherapy, and referrals. I am proud to share that, out of the 35 children in our physiotherapy unit, 10 are now able to walk with minimal support, and 3 are walking independently.

Our children have also excelled in sports, with 6 of them representing Saadhya at the Special Olympics National Championship in powerlifting, cycling, and handball, bringing pride to both their families and our school.

Saadhya's strength lies in its people. We now have a dedicated team of 80 across both our locations. Each staff member knows their responsibility, and the organisation runs smoothly, even in the absence of supervisors. This sense of accountability is what sets Saadhya apart. Our headmasters lead with integrity, our therapists are results-driven, and our board and advisory teams meet regularly to ensure we stay on course.

Looking ahead, Saadhya remains focused on both our in-house programs and community outreach. In the year 2024-25, we aim to complete our new facility and plan to move by April or May 2025. This new space will offer world-class facilities, allowing us to welcome even more children into our programs. We also have plans to open two additional sub-centres, saturating all of Hosapete taluk with our services.

As we continue our journey, I would like to take this opportunity to express my heartfelt thanks to our generous donors, officials, doctors, grassroots partner NGOs, and well-wishers. I also sincerely thank our board and advisory members, staff, and field volunteers for their unwavering commitment and efforts. Thank you for your continued support and belief in Saadhya's mission. Together, we will continue to transform lives and bring about lasting change.

Saadhya Trust is a Karnataka-based non-profit dedicated to empowering individuals with intellectual disabilities and eradicating the stigma surrounding disabilities. Established in 2016, we operate two special schools in Hassan and Hosapete, recognised by the Department of Empowerment of Differently Abled & Senior Citizens, Government of Karnataka. We aim to provide the highest quality of special education and vocational training to children and adults with intellectual disabilities.

At Saadhya, we believe in supporting individuals regardless of the degree of their disability or socioeconomic background. Our goal is to foster confidence and self-reliance in children with intellectual disabilities, improving their quality of life through personalised healthcare and rehabilitation services. # THE HIGHLIGHTS OF OUR YEAR

## NEW BUILDING

This year, in addition to running special schools at both our centres, we have embarked on the construction of a dedicated facility, a project valued at approximately ₹8 crore. This ambitious endeavour has been made possible through the generous contributions of several key donors, including Dr. K.S. Shivakumar- VESCO, Sri Kumaraswamy Mineral Export Pvt. Ltd., FIME India Pvt. Ltd., Rai Bahadur Sett Shreeram Narasigdas Ltd., Sineng Electric India Pvt. Ltd., and Linde Foundation.

On February 11<sup>th</sup> 2024, a ground-breaking ceremony was held to mark the beginning of the construction. We were honoured to be joined by Shri Diwakar M.S., IAS, Deputy Commissioner of Vijayanagara District; Mrs. Anju Sharaf, Executive Director of Finance at RBSSN; Shri Nishanth, Senior Mines Manager at SKMEPL; Shri Gangadhar from VESCO; Ms. Jothsna, Manager at Linde Foundation; along with well-wishers, parents, and supporters of Saadhya. Their support reflects a shared commitment to empowering children with intellectual disabilities and fostering positive change in the community.



## SPORTS

We take immense pride in celebrating the remarkable achievements of our students from Saadhya Special School, Hosapete, who have shone brightly at the Special Olympics National Championship.

Ms. Sindhu, one of our dedicated students, secured a gold medal in both the 500-metre and 1-kilometre cycling events, held from March 18<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>nd</sup> 2024 in Haryana. Her extraordinary performance is a testament to her hard work and the dedicated training provided by Coach Sukka Muniyappa. In addition to her success in cycling, Ms. Sindhu also showcased her skills in the powerlifting competition in Kanpur, Uttar Pradesh, held from February 25<sup>th</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> 2024. She trained under the guidance of Coach Honnurswamy.



We are equally proud of Master Tarun, who won a silver medal in powerlifting at the same championship in Kanpur. His accomplishment reflects the strength and determination that we strive to foster in all our students.



These incredible successes exemplify Saadhya's goal of "giving wings to the specially abled," reaffirming our unwavering commitment to integrating children with intellectual disabilities into the mainstream through sports and other initiatives.

None of this would have been possible without the generous contributions of our supporters. We are deeply grateful to MSPL Ltd, whose sponsorship of our training programs and facilities has been invaluable, and to the BKG Foundation for their continuous support. We also extend our heartfelt thanks to Special Olympics Bharat Karnataka for providing the platform for our students to thrive.

As we look forward, we are inspired by these exceptional athletic accomplishments and remain dedicated to empowering children with special needs through sports. The achievements of our students not only reflect their personal determination but also highlight the importance of sports as a powerful tool for inclusion and personal growth. We invite our community of supporters to continue championing this cause, as we work toward providing more opportunities for our students to excel in sports and beyond.

## EARLY INTERVENTION

The Early Intervention Program at Saadhya Trust remains a cornerstone in our mission to support children with intellectual and developmental delays. This program facilitates early identification and intervention for children with disabilities, from birth up to the age of 8, helping them prepare for integration into mainstream schooling.

A notable highlight this year was a training session on August 18<sup>th</sup> 2023, in Kamalapur, jointly organised by Saadhya Trust and the Association for People with Disability (APD), in collaboration with the District Disabled Welfare Office (DDWO). This session, attended by 35 participants, focused on equipping parents with essential knowledge about their roles in nurturing their children's development. Led by Mrs. Savithri, Saadhya's Early Intervention Coordinator, the training provided insights on preventive measures like genetic testing as well as an overview of state and central government social benefits available to families. Parents also received practical demonstrations on teaching key daily living skills—such as toilet training, feeding, dressing, and bathing—to enhance their children's independence at home. The training spurred meaningful discussions on Saadhya's services, with parents expressing strong interest in establishing a sub-centre in Kamalapur, a sentiment echoed by Mr. Mallikarjun, the Kamalapur Pattana Panchayat manager, who pledged departmental support for future activities.

Further recognition of Saadhya's program growth came with a visit to our Hosapete centre by representatives from APD and Cognizant, Saadhya's CSR partner, as part of a pilot study assessing our program's impact. During their visit, the team engaged with key stakeholders—including the government's Rashtriya Bal Swasthya Karyakram (RBSK) team, Hosapete Taluk Health Officer Dr. Bhashkar, Health Education Officer Mr. Doddamani, and families benefiting from the program. This study, supported by Cognizant's CSR initiative, delved into the ways Saadhya's services are making a difference in the lives of children with developmental delays.

Through our continued focus on early intervention services, we are dedicated to building a more inclusive future for children with special needs across the district.

With the invaluable support of our partners and community, we strive to ensure that every child under eight with developmental challenges receives the timely support they need to thrive. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to all those who contribute to this vital initiative, helping us build stronger foundations for our young beneficiaries.

## OUR SPECIAL SCHOOLS



Saadhya Trust proudly operates two branches of our special schools for children with intellectual and developmental disabilities - Saadhya Residential Special School, Hosapete, and Saadhya Residential Special School, Hassan. Both our schools are equipped with dedicated physiotherapy units, offering essential therapeutic services tailored to the needs of each child.



At these centres, we provide a range of interventions that address the physical, cognitive, and emotional well-being of our students. Our physiotherapy units play a crucial role in helping children improve their mobility, strength, and coordination, enabling them to gain greater independence in their daily lives. Additionally, we offer specialised educational programs, individualised learning plans, and skill development activities designed to support each child's unique abilities.

Through a holistic approach, our schools strive to create an inclusive and nurturing environment, ensuring that every child has access to the resources and support they need to thrive. As we continue to expand our services, we remain committed to enhancing the quality of life for children with disabilities, fostering their potential, and integrating them into the broader community.

This year, we saw a steady increase in student enrolment across our two centres. The Hosapete centre catered to a total of 195 students, while the Hassan centre hosted 65 students.

These numbers highlight not only the broader recognition of our work but also the specific demand for specialised education and the services offered by us. In specific, our physiotherapy unit and skill development programs play a critical role in supporting children with intellectual and physical disabilities.

## PHYSIOTHERAPY UNIT

The Physiotherapy Unit at both our school branches continues to support the children, providing all necessary care and rehabilitation. At our Hassan branch, there are 18 children undergoing physiotherapy and 15 children are under the Niramaya Scheme, a government health scheme.



At our Hosapete branch, throughout the year, 79 children have regularly received physiotherapy services, with 36 undergoing individual sessions and 16 participating in group therapy. Among them, 15 children are immobile and receive targeted assistance. The physiotherapy unit's success is evident in the number of children benefitting from it. There are 10 children walking independently, 6 children using rollator support, and 8 children using baby walker support. 55 mobility aids and appliances have been distributed. These mobility aids include rollators, baby walkers, CP chairs, wheelchairs, AFOs, gaiters, and standing frames. We also receive technical support from the APD to ensure the highest quality of care.





## SKILL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

### Weaving

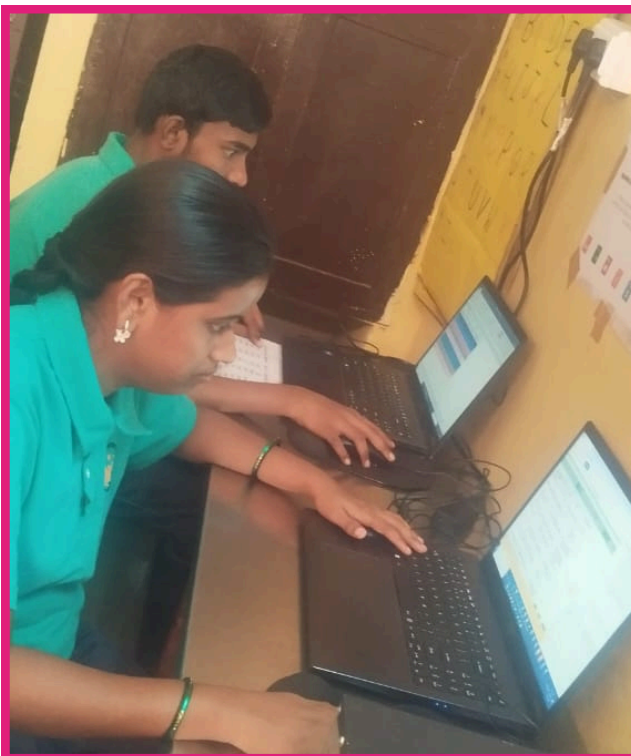
Our Skill Development Program, supported by EnAble India and Bosch with Disability NGOs Alliance (DNA) as the implementing partner, has been making significant strides in vocational training in the Hosapete centre. For students over 18 years old, who may not be able to read, vocational training is crucial.

Under the guidance of two skilled teachers, we introduce these students to simpler tasks like paper folding and paper bag making before progressing to more complex activities such as weaving mats and beading. The ultimate goal of our weaving project under the Skill Development Program is to empower them with skills that foster self-sufficiency and inclusion in the mainstream workforce.



### Computer Literacy

With the guidance and support of Amba For Life, 36 children studied computer literacy by matching alphabets, numbers, and symbols. The children were able to type in Word with minimal spelling errors, which motivated them to continue learning and eventually digitalise handwritten documents.



## OUR ACTIVITIES

### UDID DRIVE

From April 2023 to March 2024, we organised several UDID (Unique Disability ID) camps in partnership with the District Mental Health Program, 100 Bed Hospital Hosapete, and Disability NGOs Alliance (DNA). These camps provided medical tests and processed UDID cards. With the support of all departments involved, Saadhya surpassed our initial target of 1,000 cards and successfully issued 1,350 UDID cards. For any issues related to UDID cards in the Ballari and Vijayanagar districts, individuals are encouraged to reach out to Saadhya for assistance. We extend our heartfelt thanks to the District Health Officer (DHO), Taluk Health Officer (THO), District Disabled Welfare Officer (DDWO), Multipurpose Rehabilitation Workers (MRWs) & Village Rehabilitation Workers (VRWs), and the dedicated doctors for their continued support and efforts.



### AIDS AND APPLIANCES DISTRIBUTION

As part of our efforts to identify children needing support, we conducted two screenings for aids and appliances. On February 13<sup>th</sup> 2024, we successfully organised an aids and appliances distribution camp in partnership with APD, for the children enrolled in our Early Intervention Program. During the program, 55 children received much-needed aids and appliances, marking a significant step in our efforts to improve their quality of life.





The event was graced by distinguished guests including Sri Avinashalinga Gotakindi, District Disabled Welfare Officer (DDWO) Vijayanagara; Shri Satyanarayana Rao, President; and Shri Dadapeer, Secretary of the Rotary Club Hosapete, alongside the dedicated team from APD.

Since the launch of our Early Intervention Program in January 2023, we have screened 4,000 children across Hosapete, identifying 215 children with various disabilities. Out of these, 156 children require specialised aids and appliances to support their development and mobility. While we were able to distribute 55 aids and appliances with the generous support of APD, the need remains substantial.

We extend a heartfelt invitation to donors to join us in this mission. Your contribution can help us not only reduce the severity of disabilities but also work toward integrating 50% of these children into mainstream schools. Together, we can diminish the impact of disabilities and create a more inclusive society where every child has the opportunity to thrive.

## TRAINING, WORKSHOPS AND MEETINGS

### Parents Training Program

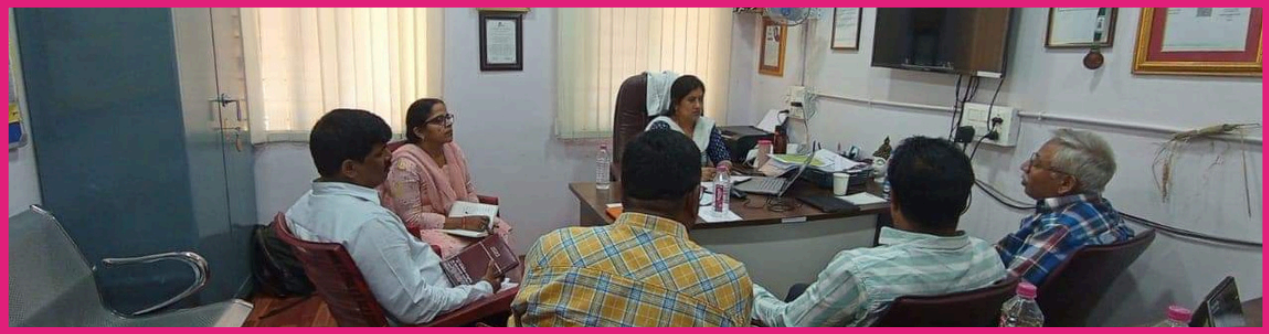
On September 13<sup>th</sup> 2023, our Hosapete centre organised a training program for parents in collaboration with APD. The purpose of the training was to educate parents on special education programs, effective strategies for managing children at home and in public, and the roles parents and siblings play in their upbringing. The event was attended by 45 parents of children below 8 years old. Our thanks to Shri Ramananda for providing the venue.





## Saadhya Trust Board Meeting

Throughout the year, Saadhya Trust regularly held online monthly meetings through Zoom or Google Meet. In addition to that, we held offline board meetings on April 25<sup>th</sup> 2023 and February 11<sup>th</sup> 2024 in Hosapete, and November 6<sup>th</sup> 2023 in Hassan. These meetings were held to discuss the activities of 2023-24 and further plan for 2024-25. Our gratitude goes out to all the board members and leaders for their efforts in making Saadhya a successful organisation.



## Self-Help Group Formation

The first meeting to form Self-Help Groups (SHGs) of parents of children below 10 years old was held at our Hosapete centre on July 26<sup>th</sup> 2023. This initiative aims to transition from institutional to community rehabilitation, with plans to form a minimum of 10 groups this year.





## Training on Autism Spectrum Disorder

On September 13<sup>th</sup> 2023, we organised a two-day training session on Autism Spectrum Disorder for parents and special educators from Hosapete and Hassan centres in collaboration with APD. The training was attended by 25 parents and 25 special educators. The purpose of the training was to spread awareness about autism among educators and parents. We thank Shri Ramananda, Trustee of JP Bhavan, for providing a free venue for the training.



## Workshop on Inclusive Development

On March 13<sup>th</sup> 2024, a one-day workshop for Village Rehabilitation Workers (VRW), Urban Rehabilitation Workers (URW) and Multipurpose Rehabilitation Workers (MRW) of Ballari and Vijayanagara districts was held at JP Bhavan, Hosapete. This was organised in association with the Department of Empowerment of Differently Abled, DNA, Saadhya, and People's Movement for Inclusive Development. The workshop aimed to enhance the understanding of the sector and equip the VRWs, URWs, MRWs, and department staff to work more effectively on policies.





## INTERNAL AND EXTERNAL COMPETITIONS

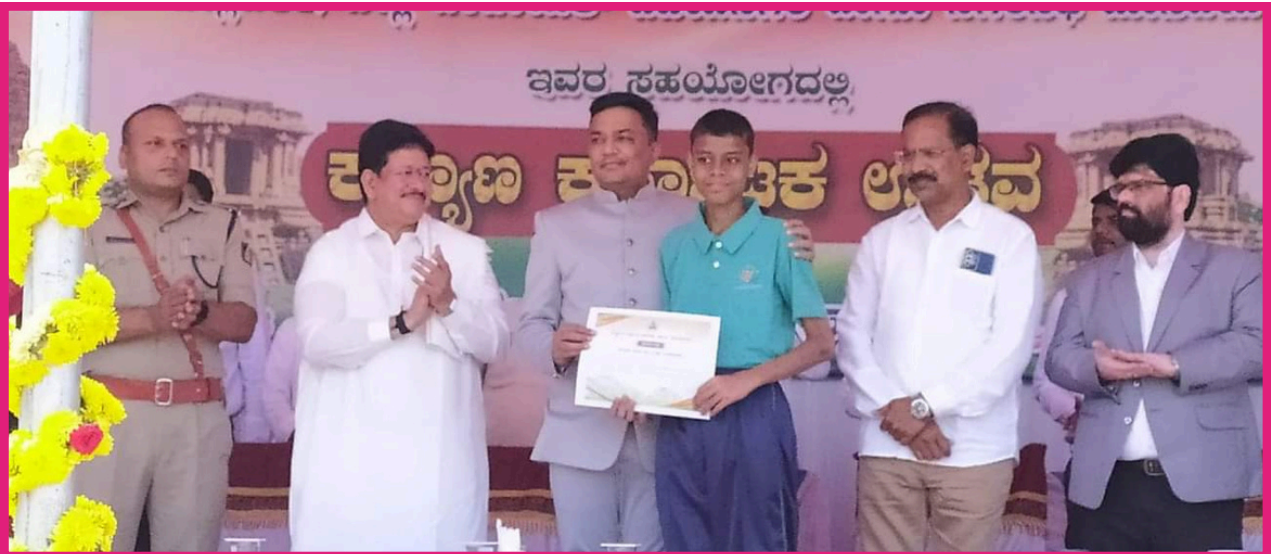
### AHIMSA Run Participation
