As I look back on 2024–25, I feel immense pride and gratitude. In 2016, Saadhya began in a small two-bedroom house with a simple dream: to create a safe, nurturing space for children with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Today, that dream has taken a beautiful new shape. We are preparing to move into our own state-of-the-art campus, designed with love and empathy, complete with scientific ramps, nature-integrated spaces, and world-class facilities for physiotherapy, speech, and occupational therapy. The new school will soon welcome 500 children, one of our proudest milestones yet.



Receiving the State Award from the Department of Empowerment of Differently Abled and Senior Citizens, Government of Karnataka, this year was another deeply meaningful moment, affirming our team's consistent effort and the trust we have built in this space.

When the year began, my goal was clear: to raise the funds needed to complete this new building so that every child could have access to quality care and education under one roof. I reached out to nearly 250 donors, corporates, individuals, and elected representatives, and we were able to achieve about 90% of our fundraising target. I'm confident that with continued support, we will bridge the remaining gap soon.

The process itself was a journey of learning. Some doors stayed closed, and many messages went unanswered. Yet, there were countless others who responded with open hearts. This helped us strengthen our compliance and documentation processes, and reminded me that patience and consistency can make anything possible.

Like every year, we also faced challenges that tested our resilience. Our regular departmental inspections keep us accountable and constantly improving. The harder moments, though, come when our children fall ill. But teamwork, compassion, and consistency always help us pull through.

This year also helped me grow as a leader. I've come to value self-awareness, emotional intelligence, and adaptability even more. Working with children who require both patience and precision has taught me to listen attentively to parents, teachers, and caregivers, and to respond with empathy.

To our board, advisory members, staff, parents, donors, government officials, and well-wishers, thank you. Your faith in Saadhya is what keeps us moving forward.

As we prepare to open the doors of our new school, I'm reminded that Saadhya's story is more than just structures. It's about people, persistence, and the belief that every child deserves the chance to grow and thrive.

About Us

Saadhya Trust is a Karnataka-based non-profit dedicated to empowering individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities and working towards a society where inclusion is the norm, not the exception. Since our inception in 2016, we have grown from a single rented facility to operating two residential special schools in **Hosapete** and **Hassan**, both recognised by the Department of Empowerment of Differently Abled & Senior Citizens, Government of Karnataka.

Our work spans special education, therapies, sports, arts, vocational training, and community-based outreach. By combining institutional programs with early intervention, physiotherapy, and social security facilitation, we support children and their families at every stage of their journey. Saadhya also provides opportunities for participation in national and international Special Olympics events, affirming our belief that every child deserves to showcase their talents on the biggest platforms.

At Saadhya, our commitment is not just to education, but to dignity, confidence, and independence. We stand for professionalism, transparency, and compassion, always putting the needs of our children and their families first.

Highlights of Our Year

2024–25 was a year of breakthroughs and milestones for Saadhya. From building our dream school to receiving recognition at the highest level, every achievement reflected the dedication of our team and the trust placed in us by families, partners, and well-wishers.

State Award Recognition

On 3 December 2024, Saadhya Trust was conferred with the State Award by the Department of Empowerment of Differently Abled and Senior Citizens, Government of Karnataka, recognising us as one of the best institutions in the disability sector. The award was presented at the Kanteerava Indoor Stadium, Bengaluru, by Hon. Chief Minister Shri Siddaramaiah, along with Minister for Women and Child Development Smt. Lakshmi Hebbalkar and Department Director Shri Raghavendra T.

This honour, presented on International Disability Day, is a testament to the tireless dedication of our staff, the trust of our families, and the resilience of our children.



Recognition of Service by the Vijayanagara District Administration and the Department of Kannada and Culture



On 1 November 2024, during the Kannada Rajyotsava Day celebrations, Saadhya was honoured by the Vijayanagara District Administration and the Department of Kannada and Culture for outstanding service in the field of disability inclusion. The award was presented by Hon. Minister B. Z. Zameer Ahamed Khan, District In-charge Minister, in the presence of senior district officials.

These recognitions affirm Saadhya's place as a leader indisability inclusion in Karnataka. More importantly, they strengthen our resolve to continue expanding opportunities, services, and dignity for every child we serve.

Partnership with Azim Premji Philanthropy Initiatives (APPI)

Saadhya signed a three-year MoU in March 2025 with APPI to strengthen and expand its Early Intervention Programme across the Hosapete Taluk. The collaboration will enable us to reach 8,000 children, and identify and support those with developmental disabilities.

New School Construction

One of the most defining moments this year was watching our long-cherished dream of a landmark school building for children with intellectual and developmental disabilities take shape. Supported by multiple corporate partners and individual donors, this facility will soon welcome 500 children, providing world-class classrooms, therapy units, and vocational spaces. For us, this project is more than brick and mortar; it is a statement of what is possible when compassion, vision, and community support come together.



Organic Holi Colours Initiative



In a landmark step for our vocational training programme, Saadhya launched a sustainable venture to create organic Holi colours from discarded temple flowers. With training and support from **Craftisen Foundation**, Bangalore, our children produced 50 kilograms of natural colours, which were sold in cities including Bengaluru, Hubli, Davangere, and Hospet, even securing a bulk order from JSW. The initiative not only generated income but also gave our children a platform to showcase their skills and creativity. The joy of seeing their work embraced by society reinforced our belief in the abilities of children with disabilities.

Admissions Milestone

This year, Saadhya experienced its highest-ever demand for admissions, with families reaching out from ten districts across Karnataka. We were able to admit 47 children, while more than 100 additional requests had to be deferred due to space constraints. While this reflects the trust and reputation Saadhya has built, it also underscores the urgent need for our expansion. The new facility will help us address this demand and ensure that more children can benefit from therapies, education, and opportunities for growth.

Our Special Schools

Saadhya Trust proudly operates two residential special schools, one in Hosapete and the other in Hassan. Both are dedicated to supporting children with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Together, these centres have become vibrant spaces where children not only receive education but also therapies, life skills, healthcare, and opportunities for growth.

Hosapete Centre

The Hosapete school is now home to 270 students, our largest enrolment to date. This year saw record admissions, with families from across ten districts of Karnataka seeking a place at Saadhya. Visits from dignitaries, including Hon. Minister B. Z. Zameer Ahamed Khan, MLA Dr N. T. Shrinivas, and Deputy Commissioner M. S. Diwakar, reaffirmed the school's role as a trusted institution in the community.

The centre also fostered strong participation in cultural events and Special Olympics competitions, with students excelling at both the state and national levels.







Hassan Centre

The Hassan school supported 83 students this year and created an equally vibrant learning environment. Children actively participated in World Environment Day, Yoga Day, Raksha Bandhan, Gandhi Jayanthi, Republic Day, and World Autism Day, making celebrations an integral part of their education.

A medical camp in partnership with the Indian Medical Association brought in specialists ranging from dermatologists and psychiatrists to ENT and dental experts, ensuring holistic health care for every child. Hassan also represented Saadhya at



Education Expo 2025, showcasing our work to leaders and policymakers alongside Padma Shri awardee Mr Harekala Hajabba.

The progress we celebrate in the Hosapete and Hassan centres is strengthened by work that starts even before children enter school. Through early identification and family support, our Early Intervention Programme builds the foundation for every child's future.



Programmes and Partnerships

Early Intervention Programme

Early intervention remains at the heart of Saadhya's mission, ensuring that children with developmental delays and disabilities receive support at the earliest stage possible. By identifying challenges in the first years of life, we open the door to therapies, education, and social benefits that can transform futures.

This year, Saadhya deepened its commitment to early intervention through multiple initiatives:

 Partnership with APPI and Expansion of Early Intervention: The collaboration with APPI has expanded Saadhya's work across the Hosapete Taluk, aiming to screen 8,000 children and identify those with developmental disabilities.



So far, 400 children have been identified with 21 types of disabilities, and 215 children have already received therapy, social security enrolment, and referral support.

- **Sub-centres Planned:** To make services more accessible, we initiated plans to open sub-centres at Kamalapura and Mariyammanahalli, each serving around 50 children with therapies and special education.
- Family Engagement: Parents were trained to support their children at home, learning practical skills like feeding, dressing, toilet training, and speech stimulation. This community-based approach ensures that progress continues beyond our classrooms and therapy rooms.



Partnerships

The success of the early intervention programme was made possible through the active support of:

- · Department of Empowerment of Differently Abled and Senior Citizens, Govt. of Karnataka
- Azim Premji Philanthropy Initiatives (APPI)
- Association of People with Disability (APD)
- · Department of Health, Education, Women & Child Development, PDOs and grassroots partners

Physiotherapy and Rehabilitation

Both centres house dedicated physiotherapy units, which remain the backbone of Saadhya's rehabilitation efforts. In 2024–25, more than 100 children regularly underwent physiotherapy. The results have been remarkable:

- 12 children are now walking independently.
- 8 children walk with a rollator support.
- 10 children walk with baby walkers.
- 55 aids and appliances, including CP chairs, wheelchairs, AFOs, and standing frames, were distributed to families in need.







Story of Change

B. Likhil, a 5-year-old boy, was identified through Saadhya's early intervention program. Born underweight and with developmental delays, he had no neck control, could not sit or roll over, and responded only to his mother's voice. After being referred by our early interventionist, his parents enrolled him at Saadhya in April 2024. With regular physiotherapy and stimulation, he slowly began to gain neck control, respond to sounds, and sit with support. For his parents, who once felt hopeless, these early signs of progress brought renewed confidence and relief.

Six months into therapy, Likhil's progress has been remarkable. He can now sit independently, roll over on his own, crawl, and even take steps with support. His trunk balance has improved, muscle tightness has reduced, and he responds actively to sounds and words. With better sleep, appetite, and interaction, his quality of life has transformed. His parents now motivate other families to seek early support, sharing their story as proof that therapy can change lives. The physiotherapist has recommended further gait training with assistive devices, and Likhil's parents are committed to continuing his journey with Saadhya.



Skill Development and Vocational Training

For students above 18, vocational training is a crucial pathway toward independence. This year, Saadhya strengthened its skill-building initiatives in Hosapete:

Weaving & Craftwork

Students were trained in simple tasks like paper folding and bag making before progressing to weaving mats and beadwork. These activities nurture fine motor skills while building employable skills.





Computer Literacy

With the guidance of **Amba for Life**, 20 students learned basic computer skills such as typing, matching letters and numbers, and creating simple Word documents.





• Organic Holi Colours Initiative

In an innovative leap, students produced 50 kilograms of natural Holi colours using discarded temple flowers, supported by training from **Craftisen Foundation**. The products were sold across Karnataka, including to corporate buyers like JSW, generating both income and pride for our children.



Vocational training at Saadhya is about giving our children the confidence to stand on their own feet and contribute meaningfully to society.

At both Hosapete and Hassan, Saadhya's schools are ecosystems of growth. With therapies, vocational skills, healthcare, sports, and celebrations woven together, every child is given the tools to become more independent, confident, and prepared for life.









Our Activities During the Year

1. Community Outreach

Alongside classroom learning and therapies, Saadhya continued to strengthen its outreach and community-based services in 2024–25. These activities focused on extending healthcare, ensuring access to government entitlements, and creating awareness in the wider community.

Medical Camp

On November 28, 2024, a Medical Camp was organised at our Hassan centre in partnership with the Indian Medical Association. Specialists in dermatology, psychiatry, ENT, ophthalmology, and dentistry conducted check-ups for all children. The camp ensured early detection of health concerns and provided families with guidance for follow-up care. Events like these reaffirm Saadhya's commitment to holistic child development, addressing not just educational but also medical needs.



Documentation and Social Security Support

A major focus this year was helping families access government schemes and social security benefits.

- 550 children were registered under the Niramaya Health Insurance Scheme, giving them access to critical health coverage.
- Claims worth ₹3.5 lakh were submitted under the scheme.
- Saadhya also facilitated legal guardianship certificates and linked families with relevant social security benefits, helping ease long-term financial and caregiving challenges.





Awareness and Advocacy

Saadhya also engaged with the larger community to build awareness about disability and caregiving:

- On October 25, 2024, Saadhya addressed an awareness programme at Masjid E Tayaba, Hosapete, speaking on early identification and rehabilitation of children with disabilities. The event highlighted the importance of inclusion across communities.
- On October 29, 2024, Saadhya participated in World Caregivers Day, organised by the District Administration and Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities. At this forum, we highlighted the challenges faced by caregivers and suggested steps to provide them with better support.





Through these activities, Saadhya continued to serve the children within our schools along with their families and the larger community. By bridging access to healthcare, government support, and awareness, we are working towards a society that is informed, inclusive, and responsive to the needs of persons with disabilities.

2. Trainings, Workshops, and Meetings

Capacity building and awareness have always been at the heart of Saadhya's work. In 2024–25, we continued to invest in parents, educators, rehabilitation workers, and the wider community through training and workshops, while also strengthening governance through board meetings and parent groups.

Parent Training Programmes

Saadhya organised training sessions for parents to equip them with strategies for supporting their children at home and in public spaces. These sessions focused on practical caregiving approaches such as feeding, toilet training, communication, and mobility, as well as introducing families to government schemes available for their children.



Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) Training

This year, we conducted training on Autism Spectrum Disorder for parents and special educators across both centres. The sessions increased awareness of autism and introduced structured teaching approaches and practical tools for both school and home environments.



Workshop on Inclusive Development

Saadhya partnered with the Department of Empowerment of Differently Abled, Disability NGOs Alliance, and grassroots organisations to conduct a workshop on Inclusive Development. It was attended by Village Rehabilitation Workers (VRWs), Urban Rehabilitation Workers (URWs), and Multipurpose Rehabilitation Workers (MRWs) from Ballari and Vijayanagara, focusing on policies, program delivery, and strengthening community-based rehabilitation.

Board Meetings and Governance

Regular trustee and board meetings were held at both the Hosapete and Hassan centres. These meetings provided a platform to review activities, assess progress, and plan for the year ahead.

Parent Self-Help Groups (SHGs)

This year, Saadhya launched Self-Help Groups among parents of children below 10 years at the Hosapete centre. These groups are designed to transition families from institutional dependence to community-based rehabilitation, offering mutual support and collective problem-solving.



3. Empowering Children through Sports

At Saadhya, sports are a powerful tool for inclusion, confidence, and self-expression. This year, our children once again demonstrated their strength and determination on the sports field, bringing pride to their families, teachers, and the Saadhya community.

Special Olympics National Selection

In 2024–25, 20 of our students participated in the Special Olympics State Championship, representing Saadhya across ten different disciplines. From this group, three students were selected for the Special Olympics National Championship, competing in powerlifting and cycling. Their journey from rigorous training to being chosen for the national stage stands as a testament to their resilience and the commitment of our coaches and staff.



Training and Discipline

Throughout the year, children are trained in 10 sports disciplines, including cycling, athletics, handball, and powerlifting. Regular practice sessions not only enhanced their physical fitness but also strengthened their teamwork, focus, and determination.

Partner Support

We are deeply grateful to MSPL Ltd, whose consistent sponsorship of our sports training programs and facilities has been invaluable. Their support ensures that our students receive the equipment, coaching, and exposure they need to excel at higher levels of competition.

Beyond Medals

Every event our students take part in, whether at the district, state, or national level, is a victory in itself. For many children, participation in sports has been transformative, improving mobility, building confidence, and showing society that children with disabilities can compete and achieve at par as others.

Sports will remain a cornerstone of Saadhya's work, as we prepare our children for national-level platforms and for the Special Olympics International competitions in the years ahead.



4. Participation in Other Competitions

Competitions, both within the schools and outside, offer our children opportunities to showcase their talents, build confidence, and experience the joy of participation. In 2024–25, Saadhya students actively took part in a range of cultural, academic, and sports events at the district and state levels.

Academic Competitions

• 10 students from Saadhya participated in state-level quiz competitions, testing their knowledge and learning in an encouraging environment.

Cultural Participation

Our students also brought their creativity and enthusiasm to cultural platforms:

- Performances at district-level celebrations in both Hassan and Vijayanagara.
- Participation in Hampi Utsav 2024 and Kannada Rajyotsava Day events, where their performances were widely appreciated.
- Independence Day and Teachers' Day celebrations within the schools also included song, dance, and theatre, giving every child a chance to participate.



These competitions reinforced Saadhya's belief that children with disabilities should be given every opportunity to express themselves, whether on the sports field, in the classroom, or on stage. Each participation was about inclusion, confidence, and joy.

5. Celebrations

Festivals and cultural events are an integral part of Saadhya's school life, offering children the joy of participation and a sense of belonging. In 2024–25, both our centres celebrated national days, religious festivals, and awareness events with enthusiasm and creativity.

National and State Observances

Both centres marked Independence Day, Republic Day, and Kannada Rajyotsava with cultural programmes, flag hoisting, and community participation. These celebrations brought joy and also offered children opportunities to showcase their talents in music, dance, and theatre.





Festivals

- Krishna Janmastami: Celebrated at Hosapete with children dressed as Radha and Krishna, bringing colour and joy to the campus.
- Ganesh Chaturthi: Students at Hosapete celebrated with prayers, decorations, and cultural activities.
- Deepavali: Both centres marked the festival of lights with shared celebrations between staff and students.







Awareness and Special Days

Saadhya actively participated in community awareness programmes, including a session on early identification of disabilities, and the first-ever World Caregivers Day, organised by the District Administration and the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities. Through such platforms, we raised the voices of children and caregivers, highlighting their rights and needs.



Children's Day and Picnics

- Children's Day: Celebrated at Hosapete with cultural programs, sports activities, and special guests from the judiciary, district administration, and education departments.
- Picnics and Outings: Both centres organised outings for students, giving them opportunities to explore new environments, build friendships, and enjoy recreational activities.









Future Plans

Looking ahead to 2025–26, Saadhya is preparing for another transformative year. Our priorities are ambitious yet grounded in our vision of inclusion and empowerment.

• Inauguration of the New Building:

By mid-2025, we aim to shift into our landmark residential school building in Hosapete. This world-class facility will accommodate 500 children with modern classrooms, therapy units, vocational spaces, and inclusive activity zones. It marks a new era for Saadhya, one where no child has to be turned away due to a lack of space.



Preparing Athletes for International Competitions:

Building on our success in the Special Olympics, we aim to train children across 10 sports disciplines for the International Special Olympics Games. With continued support from our partners, we hope to see our children not just represent Karnataka and India, but also inspire the world.





• Expanding Early Intervention Programmes:

With support from Azim Premji Philanthropy Initiatives (APPI), Saadhya will expand early intervention across Hosapete Taluk. In the coming year, we aim to screen 4,000 children, identify 200 with disabilities, and connect them with therapies, education, and social security benefits.

To ensure early intervention services reach children closer to their homes, we are preparing to launch sub-centres at Kamalapura and Mariyammanahalli, each supporting around 50 children with therapies and special education. These hubs will also serve as entry points for families to access social security benefits and caregiver training.





• Scaling Vocational Training

Building on the success of our organic Holi colours initiative, we plan to produce up to 250 kg of organic colours in the coming year. In addition, new products such as organic rangoli powders and agarbattis made from temple flowers will be introduced, giving our children more avenues for skill development and income generation.


